

# HOLY TRINITY CEMETERY RULES & REGULATIONS

## Hours of Operation Sunrise to Sunset

### Spring/Summer Decorations

April 1<sup>st</sup> to October 15<sup>th</sup> (Not permitted October 15-April 1)  
One 10 inch or less in-ground vase, clay or plastic flower pot per grave. Urns/vases should be placed to the side of monuments only.

### Winter Decorations

November 1<sup>st</sup> to March 15<sup>th</sup>  
Decorations need to be mounted on upright supports and removed by March 15<sup>th</sup>.

### Spring cleanup – March 16<sup>th</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>

Flowers shall not exceed 14 inches in depth from the base of the monument or marker. Flowers may not disturb an adjoining grave.

**Cemetery personnel have the express authority to trim/remove plantings that are deemed oversized, hazardous/inappropriate to groundskeeping.**

*Unapproved decorations or plantings will be removed and discarded by cemetery personnel.*

### Prohibited items:

Glass of any kind  
Plastic/metal designs, ornaments, pictures  
Plastic/metal/stone/wood edging and fencing  
Shells                      Wood Chips                      Gravel  
Settees                      Trellises                      Toys  
Shepherd's Hooks  
Absolutely no artificial flowers on graves  
No freestanding pots at the mausoleum or columbarium (please call the church for information about attached vases)

Absolutely NO flowers/decorations may be affixed to the covers of the mausoleum or columbarium. Artificial floral tributes may be placed in self-draining vases only.

***Ground memorials or vases/pictures on the mausoleum/columbarium must be approved by the cemetery authority.***

***Unapproved memorials will be removed at the expense of the family.***

*The cemetery is not responsible for damage to any decorations that are outside of these guidelines.*

Properly maintained American flags may be placed on graves or in approved vases.
